

MICRO FENCE SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Be sure your router is <u>switched off</u> and is <u>unplugged</u> when attaching your <u>Micro</u>
 Fence®, and when inserting or removing bits or making adjustments.
- When attaching your Micro Fence® to your router, and frequently during use, tighten all screws <u>firmly</u>, including the adjusting screws. Failure to observe this practice could result in spoiled work or serious injury.
- Always use safety glasses, noise and dust protection when using your router.
- If your router isn't equipped with a trigger switch, consider using a foot switch, so
 that both hands can grip a knob or handle before the tool is energized, thus giving
 positive control.
- Use **sharp bits** specifically designed for your application.
- Don't use **Micro Fence**® for applications other than those illustrated in the instructions without first consulting **Micro Fence**® Technical Support.
- Follow the safety instructions that came with your router.
- Make multiple passes with your router if you have a large amount of stock to remove.
- If your application positions the router bit so that it will contact the secondary wooden fence, cut the fence to clear the bit.
- Work in a neat, uncluttered area.
- Secure your work to free both hands.
- Be sure your router's power cord is free so it won't hang up or be stepped on during use.
- To control starting torque, keep balanced and have a firm grip on your router when you start it
- Develop the habit of checking all mounting and adjusting screws before, and frequently during use to insure that the router's vibration has not caused loosening.
- Take it easy, keep your brass tight and enjoy your Micro Fence®.
